VACATING ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-43-CIV

(a) Pursuant to Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, the chief judge of each judicial circuit is charged with the authority and the power to do everything necessary to promote the prompt and efficient administration of justice.

(b) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215(b)(3) states the chief judge “shall, considering available resources, ensure the efficient and proper administration of all courts within [this] circuit.”

(c) Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215(e)(3) requires the chief judge to perform an annual review of all local administrative orders to ensure that none conflict with supreme court or local rules.

(d) On June 1, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-137 extending his previously issued executive orders suspending and tolling any statute providing for a mortgage foreclosure cause of action until July 1, 2020.

(e) On May 28, 2020, this Court issued Administrative Order 2020-43-Civ establishing procedures for the continuation of mortgage foreclosure proceedings while ensuring compliance with the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act” (the CARES Act”).

(f) In accordance with the authority vested in the chief judge by Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, 43.26, Florida Statutes, Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215, and to promote public safety amidst the current public health emergency, it is hereby **ORDERED:**

(1) Administrative Order 2020-43-Civ is hereby **VACATED.**
